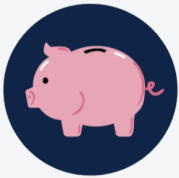

### Economic benefits of climate policies **in-district**:



**\$6.2 billion**

Invested in renewable energy, energy efficiency, clean transportation & other climate projects, including Greenhouse Gas Reduction Funds (GGRF)



**10,361** Clean energy jobs<sup>1</sup>



**\$109 million** GGRF funds implemented



**\$81 million** GGRF funds benefiting priority communities<sup>2</sup>



Equivalent of **62,000** cars off the road for one year due to GGRF-funded projects
